## + Catalysts for change

- The current environment of fee-forservice puts pressure on the way the provider interacts with patients: time is of the essence, and revenue is tied to procedures. It's a broken system.
- Though the U.S. spends \$8000 per person annually on health care, it is ranked 37<sup>th</sup> in health status in the world, far outspending other developed countries.







## + Catalysts for change (con't.)

- Medicare and private health insurers are insisting on *reducing costs*. Goal: 85% of Medicare's move from fee-for-service to value-based by 2016.
- Hospitals see that traditional reimbursement for inpatient admissions and services will not hold in a new environment of more community based care.
