On the Rise in Maine

Vector-borne diseases, such as Lyme Disease, are on the rise in Maine. Because of this, the Maine AAP has worked with infectious disease specialist Dr. Amanda Goddard to develop educational materials for patients and families on how to protect against diseases transmitted by ticks and mosquitoes in Maine.

WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT A TINY TICK?

Ticks in Maine can carry tick-borne diseases. Deer ticks in Maine can cause Lyme Disease, Anaplasmosis, and Babesiosis, Hard tick relapsing fever, and Powassan virus encephalitis.

If bitten by an infected tick, kids and adults can become very sick.

If bitten, carefully remove the tick. Call your doctor if the tick is an engorged deer tick, or if you develop a rash, fever, or feel ill within several weeks of removing the tick.

There is a New CATCH Grant to Boost FASD Awareness and Support in Maine



Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) affects 1 in 20 children but is often missed due to stigma and gaps in prenatal alcohol screening. Dr. Andrea Tracy and Dr. Lauren Jamele-Townley have received a 2025 AAP CATCH grant to partner with WIC on improving prenatal

alcohol exposure screening, promoting choline intake, and supporting earlier identification of FASD.
