In 2021, the total reported cases of abuse and neglect in Maine was just shy of 5500, with over 1000 of these being physical abuse. Adolescent Confidentiality is Often Misunderstood

Adolescent Medicine specialist Jon Fanburg, MD provides the following Pearls of Confidentiality:

- 1. Teens can be seen confidentially for 5 topics (contraception, pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, drugs, and emotional issues).
- 2. They must be capable of consent.
- 3. They must make rational non-harmful decisions for treatment.
- 4. Confidentiality must be broken if abuse, suicide, homicide, or extended hospitalizations.
